- 1. Call to Order: City Administrator Walbridge called to order the Regular Meeting of the Lanesboro Economic Development Authority at 10:34 a.m. Member Pursell entered a motion to appoint Member Goetzke as the chairperson for the meeting; Member Tacke seconded the motion. Motion carried with all in favor.
- **2. Agenda:** Member Pursell entered a motion to approve the agenda as submitted; Member Tacke second the motion. Motion carried with all in favor.
- **3. Public Comments:** No comments were shared.
- 4. Approval of the Consent Agenda:
 - A. Minutes of the Regular EDA Meeting, April 4, 2024
 - B. April Financial Reports

Member Tacke entered a motion to approve the Consent Agenda; Member Pursell seconded the motion. Motion carried with all in favor.

5. Department Reports:

- A. City Council/City Administrator/Planning and Zoning Report:
 - Zach Lind's building permit application is now being considered by the city council as the Planning and Zoning Commission did not take any action on the permit application.
 - The city council is considering whether to enact an interim ordinance/moratorium regarding issuance of any new lodging licenses for short-term rentals who want to operate in the C-1 Downtown Commercial District. Member Tacke entered a motion to recommend the city council enact an interim moratorium for on issuance of any new short-term rentals or housing licenses for the downtown commercial district for six months or until potential amendments are made to the current land use ordinance; Member Pursell seconded the motion. Members discussed the importance of preserving the downtown historic commercial district and the importance of retail business in the downtown commercial district. Motion carried all in favor.
- B. Chamber of Commerce: Member Goetzke gave the Chamber of Commerce report.
 - Chamber of Commerce board members participated in a retreat and worked on identifying their mission and goals. Board members also began work on developing a strategic plan.
 - The Lanesboro Visitors Center is open for the season.
 - Signature event posters have been distributed.
 - The Chamber will be working on new member solicitation and membership renewals soon.
- C. School Board: Sarah Peterson gave the School Board report.
 - Spring sports, field trips, and other end of the school year activities are taking place.
 - Nick Charlebois, industrial arts instructor, took students to the La Crosse Area Builders Trades Day.
 - School district employment opportunities are posted on the school district's website.

- D. Lanesboro Entrepreneur Action Network (LEAN): Cathy Enerson summarized the highlights from the April 24, 2024 LEAN meeting.
 - The group intends to be proactive in seeking funding to promote vibrancy during the Highway 250 Project.
 - New grant opportunities were discussed at the SEMLM meeting on April 30, 2024.
 - The next LEAN meeting is scheduled for June 26, 2024 at 8:30 a.m. at Paddle On Coffee.
- **6. Revolving Loan Fund Update:** Administrator Walbridge will continue to send collection letters to those who are past due on loan payments. The EDA board awaits the results of the USDA application to recapitalize the revolving loan fund.

7. Continued Business

- A. 2024 Work Plan & Strategic Goals: Director Enerson shared the preliminary results of the survey that was taken by the city council and members of relevant boards.
- B. Data Insights: Director Enerson stated new insight data will be available in July.
- C. Riverfront Property Development: Administrator Walbridge shared the next actionable step would be for the City to consider having the city's riverfront property appraised before developing an RFP. While commercial property appraisals can be costly, getting a quote on an appraisal should be considered. Member Goetzke entered a motion to have city administration get a quote on an appraisal, have city staff develop a list of potential relocation sites for the street shop facilities, have the public works department create a design wish list for a new street shop, and that city administration communicate with Lanesboro Public School District Superintendent Matt Schultz on what the school district's plan is for a new bus garage; Member Pursell seconded the motion. Motion carried with all in favor. Members having a special meeting in June to tour the municipal riverfront property.

8. New Business

- A. Vacant Building and Storage: Sample regulations were shared that can be passed along to the Planning and Zoning Commission when that commission considers developing new ordinance language.
- B. Business Interruption Loan/Mini Grants Proposal: Director Enerson explained the possibility of creating a Business Interruption Loan/Mini Grant Program for businesses and non-profit organizations due to impacts from the Highway 250 Project. Funding for the program could come from a variety of sources such as levy dollars and potential grants. Member Goetzke entered a motion to table the business item and list it as Continued Business; Member Tacke seconded the motion. Motion carried with all in favor.

9. Miscellaneous

A. Director Enerson shared the value she finds in attending meetings such as the Lanesboro Business Promotion Group as she gets to meet new business owners and share public relations tips.

1. Using an HRA levy and to fund housing projects

A Message from Our CEO

2023 was a monumental year for Community & Economic Development Associates (CEDA). 2023 COMMUNITY HIGHLIGHTS

ARLINGTON, MN POP. 2,247

- Evaluated and prepared recommendations for over 300 building and zoning permit applications.
- Assisted the City in updating their building and zoning application forms and restructuring the building and zoning permit
- Initiated discussions with a developer on constructing a new housing development and began planning for a 2024 Workforce Housing Development Program application through Minnesota Housing.

BENSON, MN POP. 3,480

- Facilitated the development of ten housing units with CSNelson Properties as part of a multi-phase, market-rate housing development on a formerly vacant City-owned site.
- Collaborated with the Planning Commission to update the City's Land Use Plan to create a Mixed-Use Zoning District for
- Facilitated the sale of the former Fibrominn Fuel Hall building to Abundant Ag, creating new employment opportunities in the community.

BLUE EARTH, MN POP. 3,174

- · Collaborated with the City of Winnebago and City of Wells to create and implement a Housing Tax Abatement Program at the City and County level, designed to promote new development of owner-occupied housing units.
- Planned and hosted week-long activities and initiatives as part of the City's participation in Welcoming America's Welcome Week, including a community bonfire, t-shirt day, community mural, story walk and bi-langual yard signs.
- Coordinated and hosted an Entrepreneurial Course through the local Rural Entrepreneurial Venture cohort to provide assistance to entrepreneurs looking to start a business, and existing businesses looking to scale and grow their business.

CANNON FALLS, MN POP. 4,220

- Purchased a 40-acre parcel of land and broke ground on infrastructure development, creating shovel-ready lots for future single-family home construction.
- Secured \$469,000 in state funding to make upgrades and improvements to the John Burch Park athletic field, including reconstruction of a limestone retaining wall and concrete seating area, spectator safety improvements and replacement of the first base dugout.
- Authored and was awarded a \$514,500 Small Cities Development Program grant to allow low- and moderate-income homeowners to rehabilitate, improve, repair or increase energy efficiency in their homes through forgivable loans.

CHATFIELD, MN POP. 2,997

- Managed the state grant contract for a \$8,700,000 renovation of the Chatfield Center for the Arts and facilitated the owner's oversight of the project.
- Administered \$410,000 in Tax Increment Financing for the construction of a 14-unit market-rate apartment complex.
- Secured special state legislation to allow for the use of Tax Increment Financing for the development of a 60-room hotel.

GRANTS DEPARTMENT HIGHLIGHTS

Authored and was awarded a total of \$75,980 across two Department of Natural Resources grants for the removal and replacement of trees infested with Emerald Ash Borer for the community of Zumbrota.

Worked with the City of Taopi on a fundraising plan to build a community center after the town was devastated by a tornado. The CEDA Grants Department held a community engagement session with residents, conducted grant research and pursued several funding sources including federal congressional earmark dollars.

Authored grant applications totalling over \$2,000,000 for communities, small businesses and higher education facilities throughout the state of Minnesota. This work engaged the Grants Department in several ongoing collaborations, including with Minnesota North College and the communities of Stewartville and Zumbrota.

PLANNING DEPARTMENT HIGHLIGHTS

CEDA offers competitively priced studies for rural communities, counties and organizations, including Comprehensive and Strategic Plans, Housing Studies and Community Surveys. In 2023, the Planning Department completed a Comprehensive Plan for Cold Spring, MN; a combined Strategic and Comprehensive Plan for Ellendale, MN; and a Housing Study for Swift County, MN.

SMALL BUSINESS TRAININGS

CEDA partnered with the Southern Minnesota Initiative Foundation (SMIF) to organize, market and host business trainings to provide business development tools to small businesses on topics such as marketing, social media, customer service and business financing. Overall, 3 trainings were provided to 86 attendees.

MARKETING INTELLIGENCE DASHBOARD

CEDA utilized their customer analytics software to complete 16 Community Profiles, Feasibility Studies and Market Potential Analysis across a variety of business types including meat processing facilities, breweries, hotels and hardware stores. These analyses can be leveraged to attract and justify new business ideas and development, growing the economic vitality of the rural communities we contract with.

REGIONAL DEVELOPMENT TOUR

CEDA hosted its annual Regional **Development Tour** through Pine Island, MN; Kenyon, MN; and Cannon Falls, MN.

SMALL CITIES DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM

CEDA works with Minnesota's Department of Employment and Economic Development to administer the Small Cities Development Program. Qualifying cities and counties can utilize the federal block grant dollars for housing, public infrastructure and commercial rehabilitation projects. Altogether, the program includes nearly \$7,000,000 in federal, state, and local matching dollars.

BLUE EARTH

Blue Earth was awarded a \$317,400 grant for the rehabilitation of owner-occupied housing. Grants began disbursement in 2022, with the completion of three projects and an additional five projects under construction.

DODGE CENTER

Dodge Center was awarded a \$287,500 grant in 2020 for the rehabilitation of owner-occupied housing. The city had a fund balance from the early sale of properties rehabbed through the program. Additional grant disbursement began in 2023.

HARMONY

Harmony was awarded a \$1,017,750.00 grant for the rehabilitation of owner-occupied housing and commercial projects. Grants began disbursement in 2023.

HOKAH

Hokah was awarded a \$721,625 grant for the rehabilitation of owner-occupied housing, rental housing and commercial projects. Grants began disbursement in 2022, with four projects under construction and several more going out for bid.

RED WING HRA

The Red Wing HRA was awarded a grant for the rehabilitation of owner-occupied housing and commercial properties. Grants began disbursement in 2022, with the completion of several projects and more going out for bid.

RURAL BUSINESS INNOVATION LAB

The Rural Business Innovation Lab (RBIL) is a cohort-based, entrepreneurial development program that aims to redefine the false narrative of rural decline. The RBIL program works with businesses in the agriculture, ag tech, sustainability, construction, waste management, water reclamation, workforce development and diversity and inclusion industries. The first cohort successfully completed the program in 2023.

WORKSHOPS

Hosted seven workshops with business experts on topics such as financial management, leadership and human resource.

CONSULTING

Provided over 250 hours of direct one-on-one consulting to eight entrepreneurs and businesses.

FUNDING

Awarded \$360,000 from Compeer Financial and \$175,000 from the DEED Small Business Assistance Partnership grant.
